The Memorial March for the Victims of Harperism, September 19th, 2015, originated from an idea by artist Steve Fick, and was organized by a small group of friends who are concerned with government cuts to social, scientific, artistic and educational programs of the last ten years as well as the ways that our Parliamentary democracy has been assaulted and dissent has been quashed.

Hundreds of people gathered on Saturday, Sept 19, 11 AM, on the Supreme Court's front lawn in the space designated for the Memorial for the Victims of Communism. Carrying tombstone-shaped signs, they proceeded to follow two drummers and pallbearers carrying a coffin draped with the Canadian flag. The solemn, silent procession led to Parliament Hill where a roll call was read of organizations that have suffered losses during the Harper regime. This was followed by a "die-in." The powerful, dramatic event was concluded with a singing of the national anthem.
